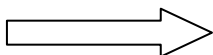

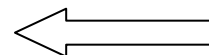

Business Casual or Agency Approved Attire

To help you decide whether an item is too trendy or revealing, consider whether your boss would wear it to a conference. If the answer is no, you should probably choose something different to wear yourself. Work appropriate, if you are allowed to wear to your job, then it is appropriate for the conference. For example, avoid wearing any tops that are too tight, low cut, sheer or cropped and blue jeans with rips. While trendy items, such as platform wedge shoes and cropped flare jeans, might look great for a night out with friends, these items are best left at home when you are packing for a conference.

- ♦ All clothes must project professionalism. Clothes that are too revealing or inappropriate aren't allowed.
- ♦ All clothes must be clean and in good shape. Discernible rips, tears or holes aren't allowed.
- ♦ Employees must avoid clothes with stamps that are offensive or inappropriate.
- ♦ Avoid clothes with political images
